The Challenge Bowl for most points in Flower classes.

The Challenge Cup for most points in Floral Art classes.

The AGC Cup for most points in Vegetable and Fruit classes.

The Joan Collins Challenge Cup for most points in Domestic classes.

The Clare Capey Memorial Shield for raspberry jam.

The Junior Classes Cup for most points in Junior section.

FLOWER CLASSES

(Club vases to be used unless otherwise advised)

1. Three Gladioli – any type.
2. Vase of annual flowers – max 9 stems.
3. Vase of perennial flowers – max 9 stems.
4. Bee-friendly garden flowers – max 9 stems.
5. Three roses – any variety or varieties.
6. Most fragrant rose.
7. Rose – one specimen bloom.
8. One annual sunflower.
9. One specimen hydrangea bloom.
10. Three dahlias – same type.
11. One specimen dahlia bloom.
12. Vase of mixed dahlias – max 9 stems.
13. Cottage garden flowers in a mug.
14. One stem flowering shrub – max 45cm (18").
15. One pot plant – max 30cm (12") pot.

FLORAL ART

16. Olympic Flame
17. Waterfall

JUNIOR CLASSES

18. Paris Olympics in any edible form
19. A pasta and pulses garden picture

VEGETABLE CLASSES

20. An amusingly-shaped vegetable.
21. Five potatoes – one variety.
22. Three onions – one variety, tops trimmed to 10cm (4”).
23. Three carrots, tops trimmed to 10cm (4”).
24. Three beetroot – one variety, tops trimmed to 10cm (4”).
25. Six shallots.
26. Six runner beans.
27. Six French beans.
28. Six cherry tomatoes – one variety, complete with calyx.
29. Four tomatoes – one variety, complete with calyx.
30. Tastiest tomato.
31. Two cucumbers.
32. Collection of four herbs in a club vase.
33. One cabbage with a short stem or 6 leaves of kale shown in a club vase.
34. Two squashes.
35. Three courgettes not exceeding 20cm (8”).
36. Two sweetcorn.
37. Two bulbs of garlic.
38. Two peppers or chillies.
39. Two aubergines.
40. Two of any other same vegetable not listed above.
41. Longest runner bean.

FRUIT CLASSES

42. Bowl of fruit of a single type – max 25cm (10”).
43. Bowl of mixed fruit – max 25cm (10”).

AWARDS

44. AGC Top Vase Class – a mixed vase of flowers containing 6 to 12 stems.
45. Tom Badrick Memorial Top Tray Trophy – a collection of 3 types of vegetables from the list below, displayed on a board or tray max 45cm x 60cm (18”x 24”).

6 tomatoes; 6 runner or French beans; 3 onions; 3 potatoes; 6 pea pods; 3 carrots; 3 beetroots; 3 parsnips (trimmed to 7.5cm (3”)); 1 lettuce (any type); 3 spring onions; 1 cucumber.

DOMESTIC CLASSES

(Jams to be presented in a jam jar, labelled detailing type and date made, with a cellophane or metal lid)

46. One jar of soft fruit jam
47. One jar stoned fruit jam.
48. Clare Capey Memorial Shield: one jar raspberry jam.
49. One jar jelly (any kind).
50. A baked cheesecake: any type and flavour.
51. A savoury bread loaf.
52. A chocolate roulade.

SHOW RULES

Adult and junior classes are open to members and residents of Aldbury and Tring Station and tenants of an Aldbury allotment. Junior classes are also open to any child attending Aldbury Primary School.

All exhibits must be staged between 9.00am and 12.00pm, after which time only stewards and judges are permitted to remain.

The Committee will take all reasonable care of exhibits and containers but will not be responsible for loss or damage.

All entries to flower, vegetables and fruit classes must be grown by the exhibitor.

No exhibitor may enter more than one exhibit in each class. Two members of a household may not compete in the same class, other than Domestic and Junior classes.

Professional gardeners may exhibit in their own name, but produce must be from their own garden or allotment.

Flowers for Floral Art classes may be either home grown or purchased.

Floral foam ('Oasis') should not be used in any exhibits.

Under 14s may enter adult classes but their age should be provided for Domestic class entries.

Pot plants, if not grown by the exhibitor, must have been in their possession at least three months.

In any one class, the Committee reserves the right to award fewer prizes than advertised.

Any protest must be made in writing by 3.30pm to the Secretary.

The Committee reserves the right to visit and inspect any exhibitor's garden or allotment after the show.

Prize giving and raffle at 4.00pm, after which exhibits may be removed. Any exhibits remaining in the hall after 4.30pm may be sold or disposed of at the discretion of the Committee.

Prizes to be collected from the Show Secretary's office between 3.00 and 4.00pm on the day of the show.
