This is the motto of the Repair Café movement, which started in the Netherlands in 2009. Maybe you've never heard of a repair café before, and it isn't necessarily somewhere you will get a cup of coffee and a cake (although it might be that too). But it is somewhere you could get something mended for free, or with a voluntary donation, instead of having to throw it out:

A broken zip on a pair of trousers,

The on/off switch on a nice old radio, which otherwise works perfectly well,

The catch on a necklace,

Garden tools, electronic and mechanical items, bikes, even glassware and ceramics could all be brought back to life.

Volunteer experts may do the mending, or alternatively help you to do it yourself there and then. The items that can be repaired vary from place to place and to some extent on which specialists are on hand that day but below are details of those nearest to us.
